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Wildlife Resources GOAL 1. Preserve for posterity the nature and diversity of Dane County's natural heritage by identifying and protecting lands and waters critical in conserving: • native, endangered, threatened & unique plants & animals; • wildlife habitats and; • native ecological communities. Supporting objectives: a. Fully implement the Dane County Parks & Open Space Plan. b. Incorporate natural resource areas in plans for parks and open space. c. Adopt effective local ordinances to protect steep slopes, hillsides, bluffs and grassland communities. d. Seek state, federal and other funding to protect steep slopes, hillsides, bluffs, grassland communities and wildlife habitat. d.
