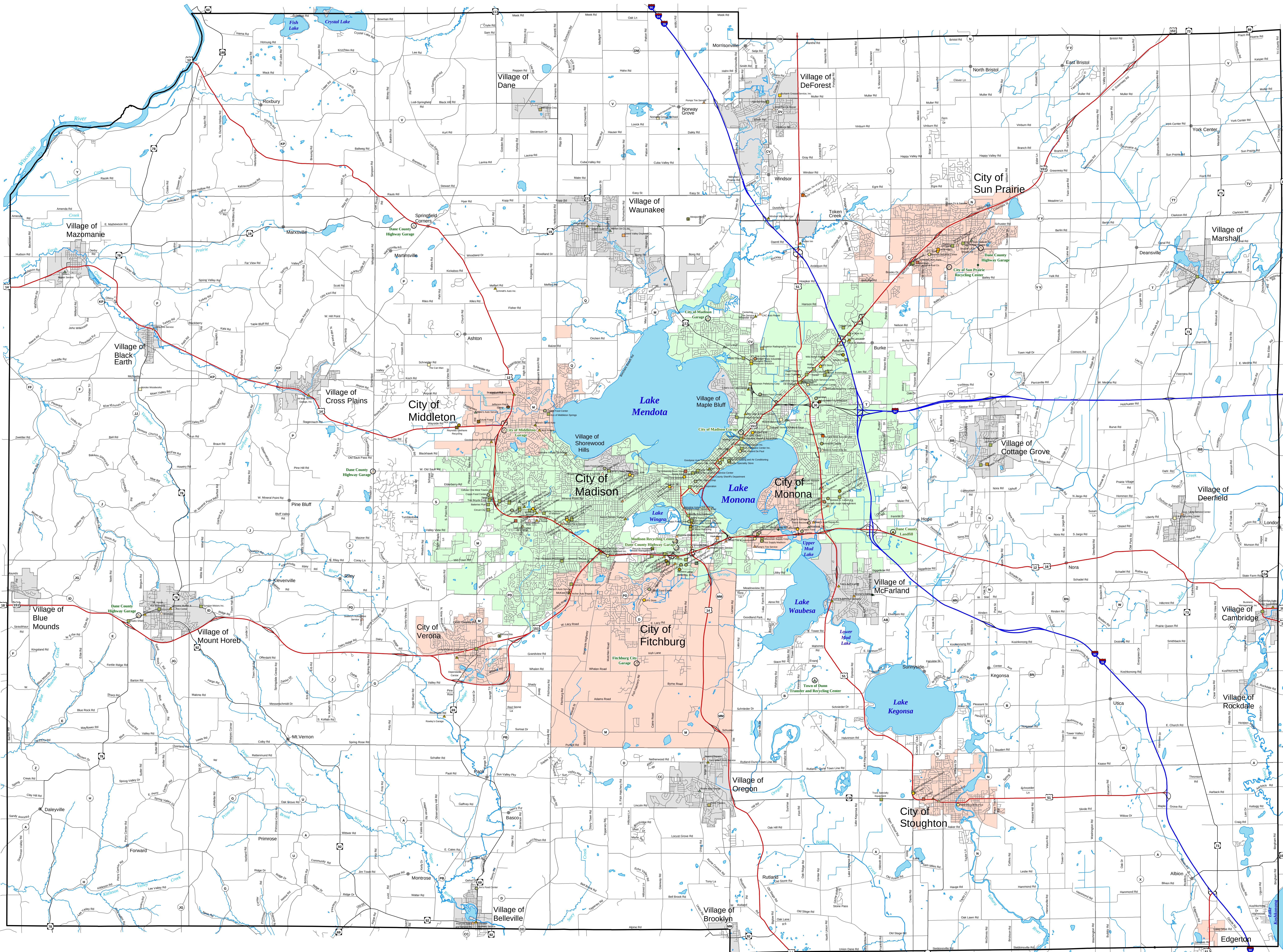

Contact your local municipality for a schedule of materials that can be picked up routinely via curbside pickup.

No distinction has been made whether or not the location displayed charges for recycling. Some of the locations shown offer pickup services.

Besides the locations shown, automotive batteries and thermostats containing mercury are also accepted for recycling at all stores that sell them and some scrap metal recyclers. Generally, a small amount of money is paid for old automotive batteries. Motor oil is either accepted for recycling at all locations that sell motor oil or information about locations for recycling motor oil will be provided.

Yard wastes are banned from disposal at all landfills in the State of Wisconsin. To provide a method of recycling yard waste, Dane County will open its three yard waste compost sites in early April. All sites are available for people to bring non-woody yard waste to be composted.

The recycling locations Green Valley Disposal in Waunakee and Recycle America/Waste Management off the Beltline near Todd Drive are considered municipal recycling facilities and are not open to the public.

Waste lamps and bulbs are regulated as hazardous wastes because they contain toxic heavy metals. If these lamps are burned or thrown into landfills, the mercury and lead in them can be released into the environment where contamination problems may occur.
